

It was so hot that day, but I never turned the car on for the air conditioning. We must have talked for half an hour.

I always loved talking to Sherry. She was pleasant whenever I spoke with her, and after getting past the "business" of our calls, she'd chat with me like we were old friends. She'd catch me up on the house, her health, the family, and often talked about the neighborhood. Last year, my husband and i moved to Germantown, where he grew up. When I mentioned this, Sherry gave me a rundown of all the best places to eat, some of which I didn't even know about!

Having lived in the Highlands for a good part of my life, I know her street well. It's one of my favorite streets in Louisville. Once, she said people had tried to urge her to move due to the never-ending maintenance on an old home like hers, but she loved that house so much and said she wasn't going anywhere!

To me, Sherry was such a classy and likable lady. From things she'd said, one could tell she was devoted to her family. While I believe my partner, Jan had met with her while her previous advisor was still in the office, and I only had the pleasure of meeting with her in person once, not long after he'd retired. At that time, it was already hard for her to get around. Although her health had been failing, she was always sharp as a tack. It seemed she knew her limitations and was making good decisions for herself. It was heartbreaking to hear the news of her passing today. She will be missed.
